

Protected Airway Equipment Checklist

- Review prior to entering room
- Only bring inside the room essential equipment

- RN - IV bundle; including IV fluids
 - RT - Airway Bundle
 - HioX/TAVISH mask
 - Resuscitation Bag with mechanical HEPA filter
 - Intubation tray*
 - Video laryngoscope
 - Hyperangulated (+/- standard) VL blades
 - Backup airway equipment for plan B (e.g. consider Macintosh 4 blade)
 - Flexible bougie (consider risk of contamination once removed from airway)
 - ETT clamp (plastic or Kelly clamp) - do not clamp if patient spontaneously breathing
 - (ETCO₂ module, waveform capnography sensor and tubing)
 - (Anchor Fast)
 - Medications for induction, paralysis and hemodynamic support; flushes
 - Post-intubation sedation and hemodynamic support infusions
 - Disposable stethoscope (only for emergencies)
 - Adjustable-height bed table or cart for equipment/drugs
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- Specimen container for ETT sample (bacterial and viral studies) +/- NP Swab
 - OGT bundle - lubricant, syringe, tape to secure
 - Arterial line bundle
 - Foley Catheter bundle
 - CVC bundle
 - Sterile gloves
 - Ultrasound, sterile gel and probe cover
 - Communication board and markers

*Standard equipment in intubation tray: nasopharyngeal airways (28 and 30 Fr); oral airways (#8-green, #9-orange, #10-red); 2 stylets; Yankauer suction tip; ETTs (2 each #6, #7, #8); laryngoscope handle (check battery); laryngoscope blade (Miller 2 and Macintosh 3); xylocaine spray and nozzle; syringe (10 cc luer lock); FEF (CO₂) detector; lubricating jelly; alcohol swabs; flowmeter nipple; pink tape; trach ties; in-line endotracheal suction catheter; PEEP valve; ETCO₂ connector.
